Praise God there have already been 58 baptisms so far this year!

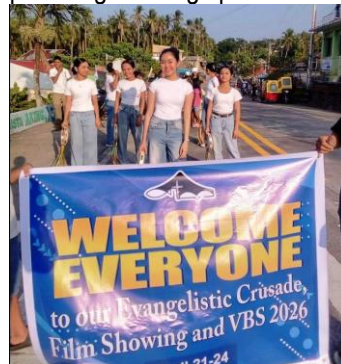


Some 2026 highlights of PAMI ministries:

January included working with a Youth With A Mission team from Germany to do evangelism near EBI. YWAM Ships returned in August to do a medical-dental mission outreach.



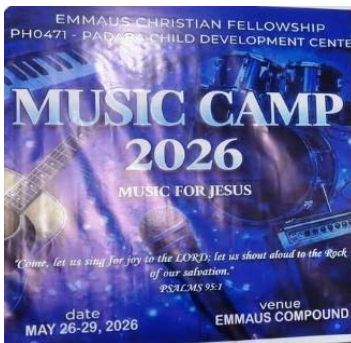
The biggest event of the year was a 4-day crusade held in Prieto Diaz in April, including PAMI people from various places coming to help conduct a parade, door-to-door invitations, film showing, music & speakers in the town square, and kids Vacation Bible School. This helped boost the pioneering work of Ptr Benjie and his wife Elah, who then followed up with three 5-day kids Bible clubs and adult Bible studies. A school principal and barangay captain are also excited to help with Values Instruction Classes, feedings, and providing meeting space.



5-day kids Bible clubs were held in various other towns too.



Besides financial gifts, could use donations of used laptops, projectors, digital cameras, Christian books & CDs, school supplies, hotel sized toiletries, toothbrushes, t-shirts, baseball hats, small toys, etc. to ship in balikbayan boxes.



Besides the crusade & VBS/kids clubs, summer vacation activities also included music camps at three PAMI churches, where young people learned skills to be used in Sunday worship services. A sports fest camp was also held in Matnog, including worship and sleeping in tents next to the ocean.



Breakthrough III was organized again by Shelly Mendizabal and held at EBI in June, a time for youth leaders to share and grow, and included an evangelism initiative into the neighborhood.

Church youth groups also had other periodic bonding times.



EBI teachers with the 5 who graduated on May 22. Elmer & Frank have been retained by Bulan/Fabrica Church and work with Pastor Felmar Guray. When the school year started in early August, 3 Freshmen were added to 5 returning students, for a total of 8.



After the typhoon damage from last fall, the Juag Island chapel has been rebuilt and a cement floor added. Reroofing was also done on the Session Hall at EBI and Garduques' Calagoto Barcelona house. \$2500 is also being spent to add an awning/meeting space to this house to replace the Buhang Church, after expiration of a ten year lot agreement in Sept. Ptr Benjie Camar of Prieto Diaz appreciates the \$1200 given to him to buy a new motorcycle. PAMI has also added more secular college scholarships, with \$2500 per semester now being split between 30 students. Thank you for the support that makes all this possible, and ongoing gifts that keep it going.

MISSION SUMMARY

PAMI is a non-denominational evangelical mission started in 1982 in Sorsogon Province of the Philippines, aimed at reaching the unreached, teaching and discipling, and assisting the poor. U.S. missionaries stayed until 1989. The work has flourished with national workers ever since. The mission has 20+ PAMI-paid Filipino workers in 20+ places. Besides churches and outreaches, there's a 4 year Bible school (Emmaus Bible Institute) with 8 students learning to be church planting pastors and Christian workers. EBI also is a center for 145 Compassion sponsored kids. Radio programs and milk feeding outreaches to children are also conducted. All this is accomplished with an annual budget of only \$80,000. Gifts are tax-deductible and 100% goes to the field.
